Hospital Information Stalls: Voice of Experience Forum undertakes outreach activities within University Hospital Wishaw, on the first Tuesday of each month and at University Hospital Monklands Hospital, on the third Thursday of each month. Over the past 6 months this outreach service has Lanarkshire become well established, and we have engaged with numerous individuals including NHS staff, patients and visitors at both hospitals.

The Hospital Discharge Support Programme and Care of the Elderly team staff have advised that they have found the range of information very helpful in planning for the discharge of patients to their own homes. In the last month, VoEF have been working with Care Opinion to pilot a new approach to gathering data which will inform the service going forward. If you are a patient or visitor at either Wishaw or Monklands, please stop at the stall for a chat or to ask for information, if we can't provide it to you on the day we are happy to contact you once we have found what you are looking for.

Engagement & Participation Partnership— Growth Pot Fund

The deadline for the 1st round of applications to the Growth Pot Fund (GPF) closed on 22nd May 2024

Misleading Leaflets: Guttering

The Scam

The Advertising Standards Authority (ASA) has recently banned leaflets offering gutter cleaning from a company called Ben's Gutters, concluding that they were misleading as they gave the overall impression that they were for a local small business or tradesperson.



However, there are concerns that the business may still be distributing leaflets similar to those banned by the ASA, with reports received from across Scotland, from Perth, the Highlands and Aberdeenshire. They use a handwritten style of text and a hand-drawn smiley face and appear to be from a local business.

How to Avoid

Before having any work done in or around your property, get quotes from as many trusted companies as possible. Find traders who have been vetted by Trading Standards through a local approved trader scheme at www.approvedtrader.scot.
